



Coordinator's Notice

Clarification of Record and Timeline

Issued from the Coordinator's Desk

(For record clarity only)

TSAA(c) issues the following clarification to preserve an accurate public record and prevent confusion among good-faith participants.

Continuity statement

TSAA(c) has **not** undergone any name change, rebranding, restructuring, or reconstitution. It continues to operate under its original call, name, seal, and public record, in uninterrupted continuity.

Any group operating under a different name, seal, structure, or claimed authority is doing so **independently and outside TSAA(c) continuity**.

Factual timeline– Updated record of events

(Dates and actions only; no conclusions stated)

- **March 2021** – Pierre Odendaal listed on the TASA website.
- **July 2024** – Official launch of The South African Assembly website.
- **8 August 2024** – Official Land Recording Office (LRO) launched under TSAA(c).
- **September 2024** – Official TSAA(c) seal commissioned and placed into use.
- **30 November 2024** – TSAA(c) formally called into session and operating under the same name TSAA(c).
- **[Ongoing]** – TSAA(c) continues uninterrupted operations under the same name and seal.
- **29 August 2025** – An external action described as a "vote" is initiated by a separate grouping, conducted outside TSAA(c) processes, and without Assembly eligibility controls.
- **5 November 2025** – A WhatsApp group operating under the name "TSAA© General Assembly" is opened for the purpose of collecting votes related to a proposed name change.
- **6 November 2025** –
 - A notice is circulated on a Telegram group using TSAA identifiers, presenting a proposed name change and voting instructions.
 - The proposed name "**Afrika du Sud**" is introduced within the same grouping.
- **8 November 2025** – (WhatsApp group)
 - Messages are distributed presenting the vote and proposed name change as TSAA-related.
 - A newly created Land Recording Office upload link is circulated and presented as TSAA-affiliated.



- **November 2025 –**
 - Claims of authority are issued within the same grouping under TSAA branding.
- **7 January 2026 –**
 - Wimpie Müller issues a public message identifying himself as “Coordinator and Marshal-at-Arms, The South African Assembly (c)”, asserting investigative actions, removals of members, and pending public notices regarding coordination authority.
- **Early 2026 –**
 - Telegram communications reflect adoption of a different name and logo.
 - The same grouping begins operating publicly under the name Afrika United State Assembly(c).
- **15 January 2026 –**
 - Wimpie Müller issues a further public notice identifying himself as “**Coordinator, Marshal-at-Arms, Afrika United State Assembly(c), former TSAA(c)**”, referencing an alleged 369-page investigative report and external investigations.
 - Communications are issued by Wimpie Müller to members of other assemblies and associated groups, including GFG-linked channels, calling for the removal or non-recognition of **Pierre Odendaal** and existing Recording Secretaries.
- **Present –**
 - TSAA(c) continues operating under its original name, seal, and public record, with **Pierre Odendaal serving as Coordinator**.
 - Afrika United State Assembly(c) operates separately, having publicly described itself as **former TSAA(c)**.

Framework reference (for context)

(The following references are provided to clarify established Assembly structure and roles.)

- The role and limits of Coordinators are described in How to Build an Assembly – Section 5 (Role of the Coordinator).
- Assemblies are seated by the people in session and are not created, dissolved, or reconstituted by proclamation or platform administration.
- Federations recognise seated Assemblies; recognition is not overridden by unilateral coordinator action.
- Recording Secretaries are officers accountable to their Assemblies and are not subject to removal, replacement, or subordination by coordinator action, funding conditions, or external platforms.
- Public claims asserting:
 - “Remove Pierre-Charl Odendaal... replace with Wimpie Müller as elected Coordinator” are inconsistent with the process outlined in How to Build an Assembly, including Section 5.

Role claim notice

Public communications issued by Wimpie Müller list simultaneous claims to multiple roles, including **Coordinator, Marshal-at-Arms, GFG Recording Secretary, and International Notary Public Witness.**



Record clarification

- TSAA(c) has **never authorised**:
 - a name change vote
 - the creation of parallel LRO systems
 - representation under alternate assembly names
 - unilateral assumption of multiple offices
- Any claims of coordinator or marshal-at-arms authority issued outside TSAA(c) continuity are **not recognised** by TSAA(c).

This notice is issued solely to preserve clarity of public record and to protect innocent participants.
